PONY CLASSES as per Horse Classes with the exception that prize money will only be paid to 1st placing if entries exceed 3 riders, to 2nd placing if entries exceed 6 riders, and to 3rd placing if entries exceed 9 riders.

Prize money will be paid by cheque mailed out to all winners after the competition.

Rosettes for Champions at each Official level for both horse and pony.

ASSOCIATE CLASSES – Trophies to 1st, ribbons 1st to 6th

CLASSES WILL NOT BE SPLIT AND EACH CLASS WILL BE LIMITED TO 35 RIDERS (which will include Pony competitors). All nominations will be logged in for draw eligibility on a 'first received, first entered' basis with NADEC members receiving priority over non-members. **Pony** competitors may enter any class but will be scored separately for placings. HC riders will be entered on the reserve listing should class numbers exceed the 35 maximum. If classes are over subscribed, a reserve list will be made which will include HC riders and the list will be in order of receipt of entry. Competitors listed on the reserve list who do not obtain rides through scratchings will have their entry fees refunded. Freestyle class numbers will be limited in accordance with the available time in the afternoon / evening program

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY ARE AS DETAILED ON OFFICIAL & ASSOCIATE ENTRY FORMS

This competition will be conducted under EFA Rules and neither the Organising Committee of any competitions to which those rules apply, nor the EFA, accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, grounds, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever. NADEC reserves the right to alter or cancel any section of this event/competition program or to cancel this event/competition.

New Dressage Rules – Effective 1 / 1 / 08

All **NEW** Prix St Georges Competitors – must have 80 grading points **plus** 2 results of 58% in 2 separate advanced tests before they can compete PSG. This does not apply to horses that competed PSG in 2007.

NEW competitors in Grand Prix in 2008 also require 80 grading points **plus** 58% in Inter II to be able to compete in EFA competitions. To compete in CDI competitions they must have gained 60% in Inter II as well as have 80 grading points.

SHARON DOE MEMORIAL TROPHY INFORMATION

The perpetual Sharon Doe Memorial Rider's Trophy was donated by Edgar and Marion Lichtwark who put together this Rider Championship along the guidelines of the "Young European Riders' Championship" in memory of Sharon who was a 'Rider' who trained and rode her horses with great harmony and style.

A 'Rider's' class, for competitors 25 years of age and under as at 1st July 2008 capable of riding at Prix St. George level, the class is judged on the rider and not on the Horse as in standard Dressage Classes.

The Judge's meet with the Riders approximately one hour before the Class and instruct the Riders on what movements that they want to see. These movements are up to the Judges to determine, there may be 12 or 20. This is entirely up to the Judges so that they can see how the young Rider will set up movements, execute the movement and even fix a fault.

After this meeting the Rider will then make their own test, the same length of time as normal Prix St George Test – the young rider also requires a skill of putting together a flowing test to show their riding abilities at their best.

The test is judged on several areas – 1.) Position 2.) Aids x 2, how the aids are applied/correctness and effectiveness of the aids. 3.) Suppleness of the seat 4.) Potential 5.) Harmony between horse and rider 6.) Overall picture.

The Rider will be announced and ride their test. On completion they will go to the Judges who will speak privately to the rider with remarks on the good moments and on points or tips that may assist the young Rider in the future.

A Judge will also speak to the public over the P.A. System to let them know some remarks on the riding; this is to give the Young Rider some encouragement and recognition as to ride at this level requires years of dedication and training.

First Aid – St. Johns Ambulance will be in attendance on both days.

Canteen – Full canteen facilities will be available over both days.

TRAVEL PAPERWORK

Within Zone Travellers will need to fill out a waybill either online or a MOVE EASY waybill. **On arrival at the grounds a copy of the waybill must be handed in at the office** – a box will be provided for waybills and marked 'Waybills Here'. Competitors and NADEC are required to keep copies of all waybills for a period of two years.

Outside Zone Travellers will need to fill out the Queensland Inter Zone Horse Declaration form only available online and to be completed on line or by ringing the DPI&F call centre 13 25 23. Two copies required, one to be retained by the competitor, **the second to be handed in at the office on arrival** – box will be provided marked 'Outside Zone here'. Ensure to travel with necessary documentation if crossing tick lines. Competitors and NADEC are required to keep copies of Horse Declarations for a period of two years.
